

David Cameron, a member of the Order of Canada and a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada, did his BA at UBC and his MSc and PhD at LSE. His career has been divided between government service and academic life. He is at the University of Toronto, currently working as an Advisor to the President. Music at St. Andrew's


