
<u>Sunday Forum – November 30, 2025</u>

Please plan to join us after worship on Sunday, November 30, when Ainsley Chapman will speak about her work at the Evangel Hall Mission, and the relationship with the Presbyterian Church in Canada. Ainsley is the Executive Director of Evangel Hall Mission (EHM), which provides safe homes and compassionate services to those in need in downtown Toronto. She brings over 20 years of experience leading projects and programs in health, community

development, and housing.

She assists the Presbyterian Church in Canada and local congregations in transforming underutilized land and buildings into social housing, focusing on congregational readiness, integrating affordable housing into redevelopment projects, and connecting churches with resources and opportunities to include housing in their plans.

Grab a coffee and then meet up in the Boardroom at noon for a timely talk on an issue that affects so many in the downtown core. There will be time for questions after Ainsley's presentation.


