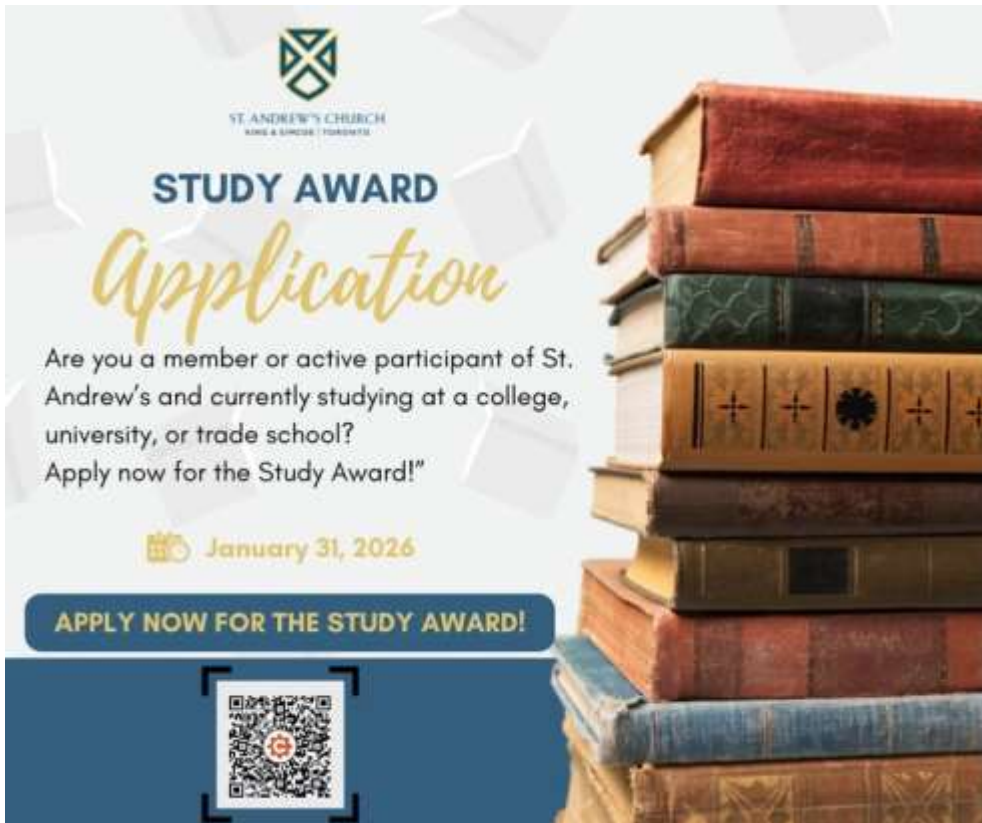


Better English Café

Charitable Donation Income Tax Receipts - Donation deadline

To be eligible for a 2025 official charitable donation receipt for tax purposes, donations must be **received** by the church in 2025. We are required to retain the envelope in which the donation came to be able to prove via the cancellation date stamp that the donation was received on or before December 31st.
