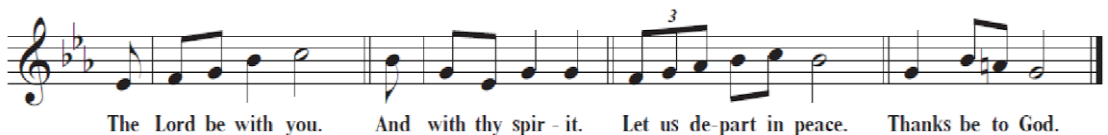

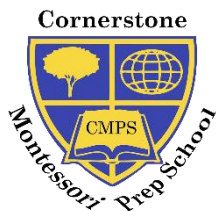
PLANNING YOUR LEGACY

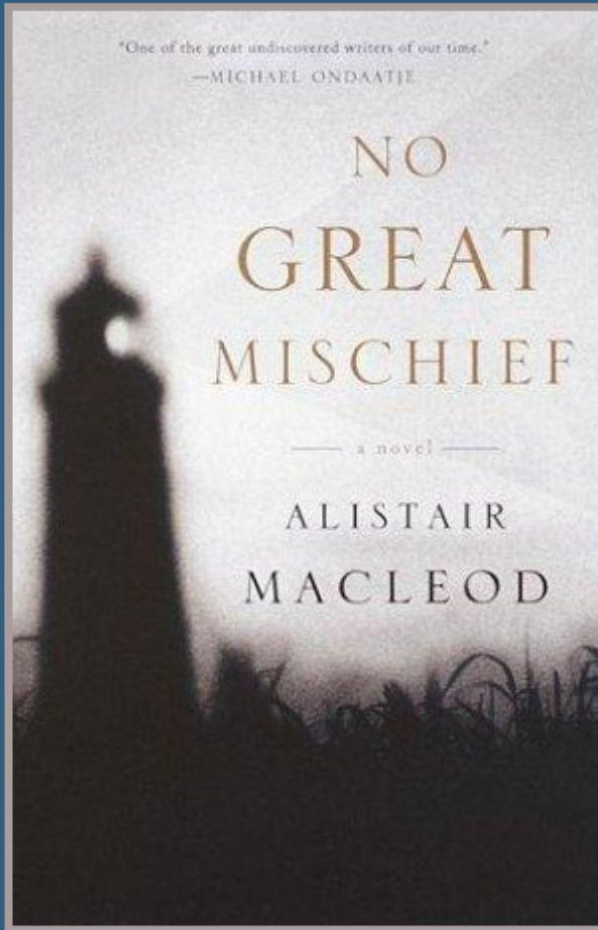
